Types of financial aid?

Merit or performancebased money without

GRANTS

Fixed low-interest rate money that must be repaid

repayment

FEDERAL LOANS

Need-based campus jobs; earnings go toward tuition, fees, etc.





Federal Financial Aid

Free Application for Federal Student Aid

- 1. Visit StudentAid.gov
- 2. Create Federal Student Aid (FSA) IDs
- 3. Wait a day, then log back on & submit 2025-2026 FAFSA for: 2024-2025 FAFSA for:
 - Fall 2025
 - Spring 2026
 - Summer 2026 (uses 2023 tax info)

- Fall 2024
- Spring 2025
- Summer 2025 (uses 2022 tax info)





How does the FAFSA work?

- Dependent versus Independent students
- Roles & Contributors (e.g., parent or spouse)
- Consent for Federal Tax Information (FTI)
- Marriages, Divorces, Separations, & Widowers





How does the FAFSA work?

- Family Size is determined from Taxes
- Number in College does not impact eligibility
- Cash/Savings, Investments, & Businesses/Farms
- Some Untaxed Income is excluded (e.g., SSA)



Student Aid Index (SAI)

The equation for determining "need" is:

Cost Of Attendance (COA)

- Student Aid Index (SAI)
- Other Financial Assistance (OFA)
- = Need*



State Financial Aid




- <u>Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA)</u>
 - Opens every October 1st at <u>FloridaStudentFinancialAid.org</u>
 - Must be completed before finishing high school!

Note – Florida awards some aid based upon the FAFSA, too



Bright Futures

- A state-funded scholarship program
 awarded to high school students who meet
 certain academic & volunteer/work
 requirements
- Students must apply for Bright Futures by submitting the FFAA no later than August after high school graduation





Institutional Financial Aid

- Foundations
 - Non-profits designed to raise donations so they can provide scholarship opportunities for deserving students
 - www.gcscfoundation.org



Gulf Coast Guarantee

- Bay, Gulf, Franklin County High School Graduates
- No application process!
- Must enroll in the fall semester after graduation
- Students are required to take at least 12.0 credit hours
- \$1,400 per year for two years
- Can be stacked with other sources of Financial Aid
