Course Description: In this course, students will survey the history of Classical music from Antiquity to the Modern period, focusing on Western Music. The curriculum may also integrate a variety of popular and global styles where appropriate. (Meets Fine Arts Humanities requirement).

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Students will discuss and analyze music using terminology appropriate for the course.
- 2. Students will demonstrate fundamental knowledge of the works of significant composers.
- 3. Students will identify connections between music and the other arts.
- 4. Students will identify historical styles and periods based on instruments and performance practices utilized.

Grading: Under normal circumstances, grades will be posted into the grade book in Canvas approximately one week after the assignment due date or exam date.

Borderline grades are considered to be .5% or higher. For example a 79.6% would be considered a borderline grade. Final grades are rounded up when students have demonstrated a pattern of ontime assignment submissions and have completed all of the coursework. Students will not be rounded up if they have not completed the concert review or missed a test.

Discussion Posts: Discussion posts are for expressing your personal, subjective opinion. Late discussion posts are not accepted. <u>ChatGPT is not permitted in this course.</u>

Concert Review: The concert review project is worth 15% of the student's final grade. The student will watch one approved concert or performance in its ENTIRETY and write a detailed paper about the performance, music, and overall experience. The paper must be a minimum of 2 pages in APA format. Example papers, grading rubric and formatting instructions can be found on Canvas. A questionnaire worksheet to help you evaluate the performance will be provided.

Exams: There will be two exams and a final. Cheating of any kind will result in failure. Makeup exams are only given in the event of a documented emergency. If a documentable emergency arises, you must explain the situation in writing and include your documentation. Documentable examples would be paperwork from hospitalization, a police report for a car accident, or funeral documentation for a close family member. Forgetfulness is not a valid excuse for missing tests. Make-up tests will not be given if you contact the instructor after the test has occurred.

<u>Withdrawals:</u> Two withdrawals are permitted per credit course. After that, a grade will be assigned. Please be concerned about withdrawals. When admitting students into certain programs, universities may calculate withdrawals as grades. There are two kinds of withdrawals---student and administrative.

- Student Withdrawal Students wishing to withdraw must complete a withdrawal form and submit the form to the Office of Enrollment Services before the scheduled withdrawal deadline as published in the college catalog. Student withdrawals initiated prior to the scheduled withdrawal deadline will be recorded as a grade of "W". The withdrawal deadline for an off-term or condensed term is one week after midterm.
